PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To familiarize students with the nature and function of human language vis-a-viz the biological, cognitive, social and cultural factors.
- 2. To develop an understanding regarding the methodologies used in the analysis of language at various levels.
- 3. To introduce students to a broad range of theoretical, applied, interdisciplinary and practical areas of the linguistics discipline.
- 4. To train students in various practical fields like translation, language teaching, Natural Language Processing (NLP), English Language Teaching (ELT) and Communication Skills.
- 5. To create awareness regarding language and identity, linguistic diversity, language endangerment, language planning and multilingualism and their implications on the society.

PROGRAMME OUTCOMES
